

Dune Detective 1

You may have noticed that the **females** and **males** of many bird and animal species look a little different from each other. Look at each of these pairs:

Painted Dragon





The male has a **bluish body** with a **yellow** or **orange** head, whereas the female is predominantly **brown**.

Magpie Lark





The male has a black throat and face with a white eyebrow, whereas the female has a white throat and face.

Superb Fairy-wren





The male is blue and black whereas the female is brown with a white front and a blue tail.

Some **Plants** also are male or female and we tell which is which by looking at the **flowers** and **fruit**.

Coast Saltbush





The male plant has large spikes of **Purple globules** which gradually turn yellow as the flowers mature. The female has tiny clusters of **yellow/green flowers** between the stems and the leaves.

Drooping Sheoak





The male plant has long, drooping, **golden-brown flowers** whereas the female's flowers are small, **furry red globes**. The female flowers develop into woody cones which produce dark brown seeds.

Coast Bitterbush





The male has long flower spikes whereas the female has small clusters of flowers which later develop into egg-shaped fruits about 1 cm in diameter.
